DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE OF TOURISM SECTOR EMPLOYEES

The travel services industry group is comprised of travel arrangement and reservation services. With a total labour force of 48,245 people, it accounted for 2.9% of total tourism sector employment in 2006.

Four out of ten people working in the travel services industry were employed in Ontario (39.2%). More than ninety percent of travel services businesses had fewer than 20 employees, with 60.6% of these organizations employing just 1-4 people. Overall, the proportion of small businesses (less than 20 employees) in this industry group was 13.1% higher than in the tourism sector overall and the largest of any individual industry group. Just 5.0% of people working in travel services were union members.

DEMOGRAPHIC FAST FACTS:

The share of women working in this industry group (70.5%) was significantly higher than in the total tourism sector (52.3%).

Since 2001, the share of people in travel services aged 45 years and over increased 7.0% (from 31.5% to 38.5%).

Eighty percent (80.1%) of people in this industry work full-time.

One-in-three (29.5%) travel services workers has a mother tongue other than French or English.

This industry group had a higher proportion of workers born outside of Canada (33.6%) than the tourism sector (23.7%) and Canadian labour force as a whole (22.1%).

Eighty-six percent of the travel services labour force do not attend school.

This industry had a larger proportion of workers with an apprenticeship or trades certificate or diploma (44.9%) than the tourism sector (25.9%) or the Canadian labour force as whole (32.4%).
