

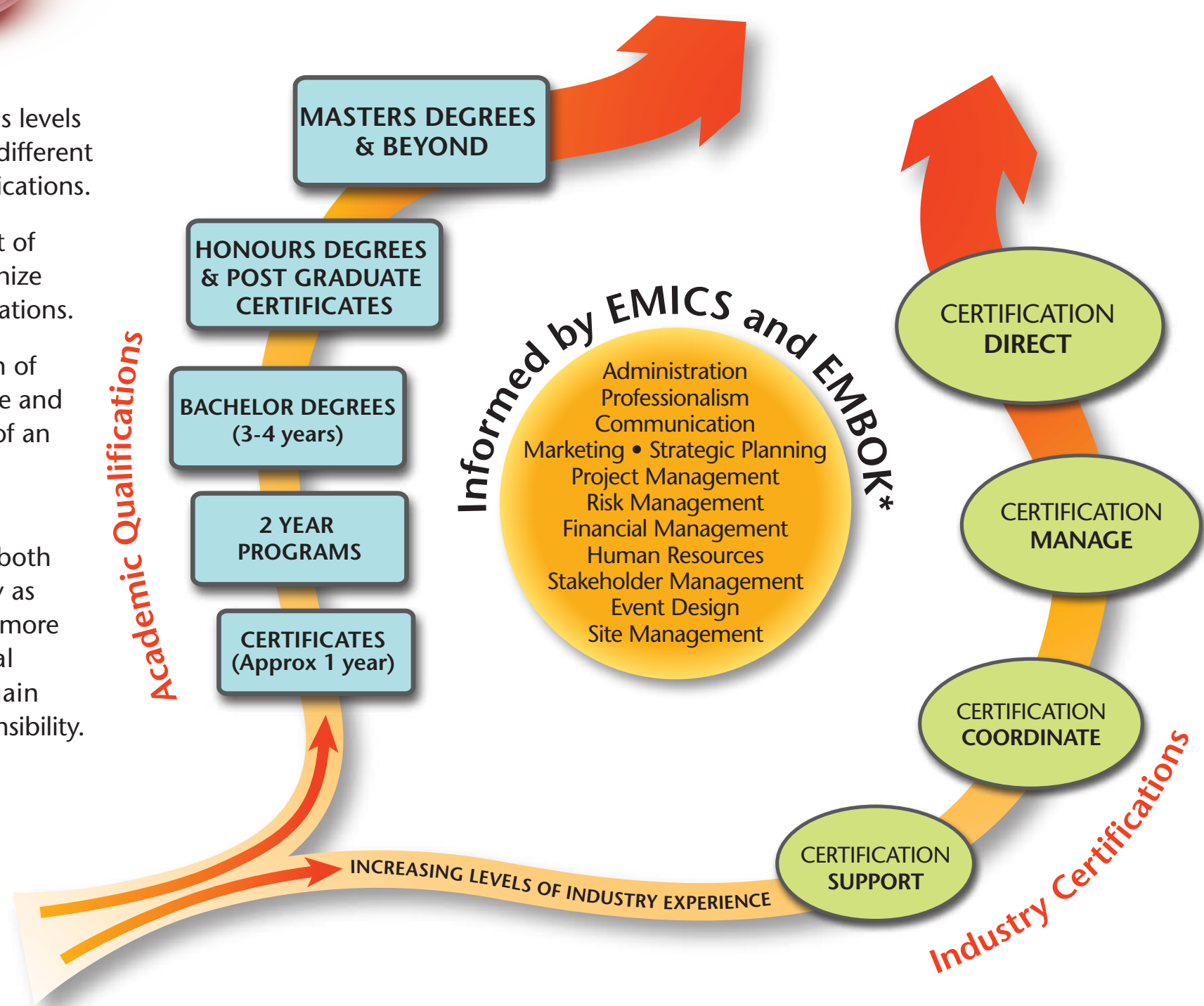
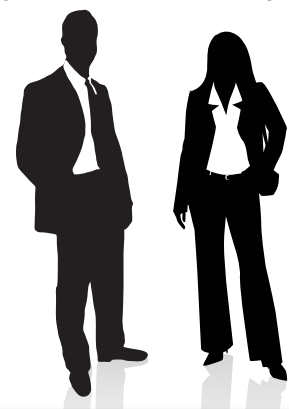
Pathways to Recognition

IEQF illustrates various levels of learning and links different types of global qualifications.

IEQF is based on a set of criteria to help recognize and compare qualifications.

There is a progression of learning, performance and experience required of an event professional.

The events industry encourages mobility both laterally and vertically as practitioners develop more complex professional competencies and gain higher levels of responsibility.



Progression of Workplace Responsibilities:		Industry Certifications	Academic Qualifications	
Four	<b>Direct</b> Individuals working at the Direct level plan events based on research, knowledge of, and involvement in the broader industry, and are responsible for connecting events to overall organizational strategies and business plans. They work with other departments in the organization where applicable.	Events-related learning	Events-related learning	General Education and National Qualifications Frameworks Level
Three	<b>Manage</b> Individuals working at the Manage level are responsible for planning and managing events to achieve the goals & objectives of the strategic plan. They may report to a director, or may have full responsibility for an event.			
Two	<b>Coordinate</b> Individuals working at the Coordinate level are responsible for coordinating and implementing events plans. They report to an events manager/organizer.			
One	<b>Support</b> Individuals working at the Support level provide services to event coordinators and managers. They work under full supervision.			

Setting a Direction

The next phase of the development of the IEQF should involve pilots to place specific qualifications on the framework, and the development of an international governance and administration structure.
